

All our performers understand the special quality of the Festival and they are happy to share in its warm and family-like atmosphere.

2017 has been an eventful year as we now collaborate with the "Concerts du Château de Versailles". The Festival is also keen to support the Yehudi Menuhin International Violin Competition that will take place in Geneva - its first time in Switzerland - from 12th to 22nd April 2018. I am particularly proud to mention our partnership with the Vincenzo Bellini International Belcanto Contest in our effort to preserve the purity of the Belcanto tradition.

This year we shall pay tribute to Mstislav Rostropovitch (1927-2007) for the tenth anniversary of his passing and to Maria Callas (1923-1977) on 4th January 2018 with a conference given by her biographer Helena Matheopoulos. Sasha Rozhdestvensky and Christoph Croisé along with the Young Eurasian Soloists will be the first to pay tribute to Rostropovitch on December 30. Their programme will mostly be devoted to

> Among the artists joining us for our 12th edition, let us mention Deborah Nemtanu, an upcoming talented violinist who will play for us on January 1, and the renowned violinist Julian Rachlin who will perform on January 5. Let us not forget the composers Yves Prin and Willy Merz, who will be discussing contemporary music creation on January 3.

> Singing is always a big part of the Festival. Soprano Béatrice Villiger and baritone Stephen Lancaster will delight us on December 31 with a nod to Pavarotti. The young soprano Melody Louledjian who was recently revealed at the Grand Theatre in Geneva will pay tribute to

Jacques Offenbach and his contemporaries on January 3. The exceptional tenor Marcelo Álvarez will treat us to some treasures of bel canto and zarzuela on January 4 that will also remind us of the great Pavarotti. On January 6 the one and only Nathalie Stutzmann will both conduct and sing with the Orfeo 55 ensemble.

The legendary pianist Ilan Rogoff, a student of Vladimir Horowitz and Claudio Arrau, will give the final touch to the Festival on January 8.

Our Festival may focus on music but it never forgets the importance of words. Spoken words convey their own melody... Brigitte Fossey, Nelson Montfort, Arielle Dombasle and Marc Bonnant will remind us of the beauty and the refinement of the French language.

Let us finally mention our ever growing Masterclasses! Ilan Rogoff will give a piano masterclass and the wonderful sopranos Inva Mula and Leontina Vaduva along with conductor Marco Guidarini will be back to teach the art of singing.



THE ART OF NAJEAN'S GLASS



Aristide Najean's home and furnace are so full of his own colourful, elaborate glass works that they could easily be mistaken for private galleries. Delicate cherry blossom chandeliers inspired by Japanese poetry – each 5ft wide – fourish in the living room, while a series reminiscent of monastic candelabra, with opaque glass dripping like wax, adorn the kitchen. In the furnace, the constantly boiling oven fuses minerals together, ready for the next stunning glass creation.

Born and bred in Paris, Aristide arrived on Murano in 1986 to study the Venetian island's renowned, centuries-old glassmaking techniques. Originally a painter, he saw glassmaking as an extension of this, and it became his preferred material. His chandeliers are inspired by both painting and glassmaking which mutually interact and are each pushed to their limits. "Aristide observes everything consistently, methodically, analytically," says Sylvie Plassnig, his partner of 19 years. "He is always open to inspiration and his oeuvre is completely different to anything else."

Aristide's glass art is inspired by its Muranese heritage, but his creativity, his appreciation of colour, and his fresh, poetic and innovative light creations represent a new approach, raising its status to that of contemporary art. and their Zenith sur la Lagune collaboration brought the rival French and Italian glass traditions together for the very first time. The result is spectacular, with Aristide's brightly coloured stags bursting from Baccarat's intricate, sparkling cut-glass chandelier.

Aristide's work has caught the attention of world-renowned designers including Starck, Jouin, Wilmotte, Moinard and Manku, and can be seen in such high-end hotels as The Dorchester in London, Le Royal Monceau in Paris and the Palazzina G in Venice. He also receives many private commissions.

"Meeting a customer is always exciting," he says. "It involves balancing their requirements with what I feel for them. I want to create works of art that fit them exactly, and bring happiness into their home. Using my intuition and sensitivity, I quickly conceptualise the artwork they're looking for." Aristide's commitment to the craft is palpable – and it is forever crystallised in each of his masterpieces.

Bach - Busoni : Chaconne


Bach composed the chaconne sometime between 1718 and 1720. Historians speculate that Bach composed it after returning from a trip and found his wife (and the mother of seven of his children) Maria Barbara had died. Musicologists believe that this 15 minutes work is a lament and homage to his departed wife by a grieving composer, including lutheran and protestant themes.

Bach, as a cosmologist, mathematician and numerologist, based the Chaconne on units of 4 bar phrases. Multiplying the 4 bars by the power of 4, equals the total of 256 bars contained in the Chaconne.

Composed for violin solo, the Chaconne is the fifth and last movement of the second Partita for violin solo. It has been transcribed and arranged for many instruments; Nicanor Zabaleta for the harp, Andres Segovia for Guitar, Leopold Stokowsky for a symphony orchesra and Organ, Schumann and Mendelssohn for violin & Piano, Brahms for the left hand on piano as well as arrangements for wind instruments, Cello, and even Marimba.

Brahms, in his letter to Clara Schumann, declares: "On one stave, for a small instrument, the man writes a whole world of the deepest thoughts and most powerful feelings. If I imagined that I could have created, even conceived the piece, I am quite certain that the excess of excitement and earth-shattering experience would have driven me out of my mind".

The most famous versión of the Chaconne is the arrangement by Feruccio Busoni. A neo classical composer and piano virtuoso he Meticulously maintains the structural, spiritual and emotional contents, while converting the Chaconne it into a virtuoso work for piano solo.

Chopin's interest in folk music stems from his early childhood in Poland and is reflected in his Mazurkas, Polonaises and songs. As the composer spent most of his adult life in France and travelling across Europe, it is not surprising that this interest was extended to other cultures and expressed in his use of the Bel Canto tradition, in his Barcarolle, Tarantelle, Berceuse, Bolero, Escossaises, Rondo, Waltzes and above all in the Ballades.

The masterclasses are given freely to young and promising musicians by the greatest artists from Romania, Albania and Italy. The classes could not take place without the extraordinary generosity and vision of a patron who wishes to remain unnamed.



Marcelo Alvarez is one of the most important singers of his generation. He excels in the interpretation of Verdi and of the Verism in general.

His operatic debut was as Count Almaviva in Rossini's "Barber of Seville". He soon added French composers and belcanto to his repertoire before moving on to Verdi and the Verist movement.

Alvarez has appeared on most stages across the world and in the main music Festivals, whether in Europe or the Americas. He has sung all the major tenor parts under the baton of celebrated conductors such as James Levine, Zubin Mehta, Riccardo Chailly and Riccardo Muti, to name but a few. Alvarez has recorded over thirty albums and recently released a CD celebrating his 20th anniversary as a singer.



MARIE-CÉCILE BERTHEAU

Marie-Cécile Bertheau studied the piano in Nancy then went on to obtain a first prize at the National Music Academy in Lyon. She rounded up her studies at the Royal Northern College of Music of Manchester in Renna Kellaway's class and obtained a Post Graduate Diploma of Music. She has performed in many festivals such as the Roque d'Anthéron, Aixen-Provence, Royaumont and Saint-Jean de Luz, where she was awarded the Maurice Ravel prize. She worked as an accompanist for several wind instrument classes at the National Music Academy in Lyon before being appointed Head of Singing at the Lyon Opera House.

She now directs singing at the Lausanne Opera Theater and works with conductors including Jonathan Darlington, Evelino Pidò, Armin Jordan, Corrado Rovaris, Jane Glover, Louis Langrée, Jesús López Coboz, Nicolas Chalvin and Christophe Rousset. She also runs a class for young singers at the Lausanne Music Academy and has appeared in performances of « drôles de Dames » and « Elle connaît la chanson ».



MARC BONNANT,

Marc Bonnant was born on 29th October 1944 to a family of diplomats and lawyers. He obtained his law degree at the University of Geneva in 1967 and successfully passed his bar exam in 1971. In 1982 he created a contest of public speaking and has been its chairman to this day. He became the youngest president ever of the Geneva Bar in 1985.

In 1996 Marc Bonnant and Dominique Warluzel opened the law office Bonnant Warluzel & Partners and very soon Marc Bonnant was hired by personalities from all over the world either on the plaintiff's or on the defence side. He has famously been the Mujahideen's lawyer in their fight against the Iranian Mullahs and was the counsel of Russian oligarch Dmitri Rybolovlev's wife in their recent divorce case.

Not only is Bonnant a renowned lawyer but as a Greek and Latin scholar he is famous for passionately defending the French language and literature. He has appeared several times on stage to celebrate his love of words. He is considered one of the finest living French speakers and has been ordained officer of the Légion d'Honneur. He has also received the "Prix du rayonnement français".



GAUTIER CAPUÇON



Born in Chambéry in 1981, Capuçon began playing the cello at the age of five. He studied at the Conservatoire National Supérieur in Paris with Philippe Muller and Annie Cochet-Zakine, and later with Heinrich Schiff in Vienna. The winner of various first prizes in many leading international competitions, Capuçon was named 'New Talent of the Year' by Victoires de la Musique in 2001.

Gautier Capuçon is a true 21st century ambassador for the cello. Performing each season with many of the world's foremost conductors and instrumentalists, he is also founder and leader of the Classe d'Excellence de Violoncelle at the Fondation Louis Vuitton in Paris. He is acclaimed internationally for his deeply expressive musicianship and exuberant virtuosity, as well as for the glorious sonority of his 1701 Matteo Goffriller cello.

Over recent years Capuçon has performed with the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, Tonhalle-Orchester Zürich, Chamber Orchestra of Europe, New York Philharmonic, NHK Symphony, Sydney Symphony and Mariinsky orchestras, as well as with many other major orchestras.

A regular recital and chamber musician, Capuçon appears annually in the major halls and festivals worlwide. Highlights this season include a return to Carnegie Hall (with Daniil Trifonov), an extensive international recital tour with duo partner Jérôme Ducros and performances at Verbier. Other artists with whom Capuçon regularly performs include Martha Argerich, Daniel Barenboim, Renaud Capuçon, Katia and Marielle Labèque, Jean-Yves Thibaudet, and the Artemis and Ébène quartets. Moreover he often collaborates with contemporary composers.





NICOLAS CELORO

Nicolas Celoro is a French pianist and composer of Neapolitan and Andalusian origin. He received several prestigious awards at a young age, including the first prize of the National Music Academy in Paris. His professor the famous pianist György Cziffra, who coached Celoro for four years, describes him as not only a great technician but also as a deeply refined musician. Celoro has performed in over twenty countries and on the most renowned stages of Europe, America and Asia. His repertoire favors the Romantic period but he also likes to interpret his own compositions that echo the style of Debussy, Liszt and Mussorgski, with a lyrical and poetic flair. Celoro often performs with celebrated actors or comedians narrating the life of composers such as Bethoven, Chopin or Liszt. He also appears in shows comprising visual elements such as photographs or movies which he accompanies with his own music and improvisations.

Celoro likes to say "Listen to silence \dots And let the music carry you away...."



CHRISTOPH CROISÉ

The cellist Christoph Croisé was born in 1993 and started playing at the age of seven under the guidance of Katharine Kuehne. He then studied at the Berlin University of Arts and made his debut aged 17 at Carnegie Hall in New York. He appears regularly in world-renowned concert halls, such as the Tonhalle in Zurich or the Philarmonia in St Petersburg. and several of his concerts have been broadcast live on radio and television.

As as soloist he has appeared under the baton of much acclaimed conductors with various orchestras. He is regularly invited to perform at prestigious festivals such as the Lucerne Festival and the Menuhin Festival in Gstaad. As a chamber musician he has played alongside many famous artists.

Christoph Croisé has been the recipient of numerous prizes at international competitions including the Manhattan International Music Competition 2016 and the First Berliner International Music Competition where he won the Gold Medal with honors in 2017.

Croisé plays on a Goffriller cello made in Venice in 1712.



ARIELLE DOMBASLE

Arielle Dombasle was born in Connecticut but spent most of her child-hood in Mexico. Her father was an industrialist who collected pre columbian art. Her mother passed away when Dombasle was only ten years old. As a young teenager fascinated by ballet and theater she put together her own acting company in Mexico.

A free spirit eager to expand her horizons, Dombasle flew to Paris in 1976 and joined the National Music Academy while taking acting classes on the side. Her first appearance was in "Perceval le Gallois" by Eric Roehmer. Dombasle and Roehmer made several other movies together, including "Le Beau Mariage" and "Pauline à la Plage". The actress appeared in many indie works by other directors but box office success came in 1994 with "Un Indien dans la Ville" alongside Thierry Lhermitte. Other hits followed but as from the year 2000 Dombasle decided to devote herself to singing.

Her first album was recorded in 2003 and since then she has produced several more, including the widely acclaimed "C'est si bon" in 2006. In 2007 Dombasle created a huge buzz by performing in the Crazy Horse burlesque show.



JERÔME DUCROS

Jérôme Ducros was born in 1974 and started studying the piano with Françoise Thinat at the Orléans Music Academy. He then went on to the National Music Academy in Paris to perfect his studies with Gérald Frémy and Cyril Huvé. He attended several masterclasses - with Christian Zacharias among other professors - and also studied composing.

In 1994 he obtained the second prize of the first International Umberto Micheli piano competition organized at the Scala Theater by Maurizio Pollini. He also received a special award for best interpretation of the set piece, "Incises" by Pierre Boulez.

He has played in Europe's, Asia's and America's most prestigious theaters with the world's most acclaimed orchestras and conductors.

He has a special liking for chamber music and has performed with Europe's most celebrated ensembles and artists, such as Augustin Dumay, Gautier Capuçon and Quatuor Ebène. In 2007 he played alongside Maxim Vengerov at the "Victoires de la Musique" in Paris.

He is a favored accompanist of many great sopranos and singers and has become Philippe Jaroussky's privileged musical partner since 2007. Together they perform French airs on the world's greatest stages.

BRIGITTE FOSSEY

Brigitte Fossey was only five years old when she starred in the acclaimed movie "Jeux Interdits" by René Clément. A few year later she played in "Le Grand Meaulnes" although her parents had largely managed to keep her away from film sets.

Fossey went on to become a major film star appearing in "Les Valseuses", "L'homme qui aimait les femmes" and "La Boum". She then favored television and was one of the main characters in series such as "Les Gens de Mogador" and "Le Château des Oliviers". She received a major award for the latter production in 1994.

Nowadays Fossey likes to appear on stage whether as a comedian or as a narrator. Her philanthropic work is also a very important part of her life.



MARCO GUIDARINI

Marco Guidarini studied conducting with Franco Ferrara and became assistant to Sir John-Elliot Gardiner in Lyon making his operatic debut there with Falstaff. He went on to conduct at the opera houses of New York (Metropolitan), Los Angeles, Minneapolis, Sydney, Nice, Barcelona, Seville, Bologna, Naples, Berlin (Deutsche Oper), Munich (Bayerische Staatsoper), Leipzig, Welsh National Opera, Scottish Opera, English National Opera, Copenhagen and at many festivals.

In the concert hall, he has conducted the Orchestre National de France, Melbourne Symphony, Orchestra of the Südwestfunk Baden-Baden, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Japan Virtuoso Symphony Orchestra, Leipzig Gewandhaus among others.

Between 2009 and 2012 he was Artistic Director of the Rencontres Musicales de Puteaux, a festival around Bellini who died in that town in 1835. He is Chairman of the Bellini Competition which arose from the festival and took place in Catania in 2012. His recordings with the Orchestre Philharmonique de Nice including the complete Piano Concertos of John Field and complete concertos of Lalo have appeared on the Talent label.

In 2013, he made his debut at the Bolshoi conducting Turandot and returned with the same production in 2014. Thereafter he made his debut at the Prague State Opera with Mefistofele and returned to conduct Romeo and Juliette in Prague.



TERRY FRANÇOIS

Terry François has been conducting and singing in gospel choirs since the age of sixteen. In 1998 he joined the famous Golden Gate Quartet as their bass vocalist.

Terry François asserts that anybody can learn how to sing gospel music. It not only requires technical skills but above all one needs to feel the commitment and the pleasure of singing in a choir.

Terry François shares his time between Geneva and Paris where he founded a school called TF Gospel Singers in 2002 that now counts close to 150 pupils.



CAROLINE HAFFNER

Princess Caroline Murat was born in Paris in 1948. She started playing the piano at the age of four and went on to become the youngest pupil ever at the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique in Paris. As a teenager she was awarded an impressive number of distinctions and was the first Western student allowed to study in Moscow at the Tchaikovsky Academy of Music. She rounded up her studies in the United States as a recipient of the Fullbright scholarship granted by Eunice Kennedy Shriver.

Princess Murat's career started in Paris and from that moment on she enjoyed the privilege of performing in the greatest theaters and opera houses all around the world. While being a great interpreter of the romantic composers she is equally at ease with 20th century names such as Henri Dutilleux or Olivier Messiaen

Mstislav Rostropovitch, Placido Domingo and Maxim Vengerov, among other fellow musicians and connoisseurs, speak of Princess Caroline Murat's brilliant virtuosity, profound musicianship and the dramatic intensity of her playing.

Before creating the Gstaad New Year Music Festival Princess Murat co-founded the Verbier Music Academy with Martin Engstroem and also was one of the founding members of the 'Sommets musicaux' in Gstaad.

She is known in the musical world as Caroline Haffner, using her mother's surname.

ANUSH HOVHANNISYAN

Soprano Anush Hovhannisyan is praised as "hypnotically striking" (The Arts Desk), "glamorous, excitingly temperamental" (The Sunday Times) and her voice is "rich and vibrant, smoky and spiritual" (Music OMH). Anush is the winner of First and Public Prizes, Deutsche Grammophon and Royal Danish Opera special prizes at the Stella Maris competition 2016. She was also a finalist at the BBC Cardiff Singer of the World 2017. As a Jette Parker Young Artist she performed at the Royal Opera House Covent Garden from 2013 to 2015, and has worked under renowned conductors such as Renato Balsadonna, Semyon Bychkov, Nicola Luisotti and Sir Antonio Pappano.

Her performances have also included the soprano solos in Gloria for the Royal Ballet and Messa di Requiem for the Royal Opera House tour to France, Donna Elvira (Don Giovanni) at the Teatro Verdi di Trieste, and Lady in Waiting (Macbeth) for the Royal Opera's 2015 tour to Japan.

Anush studied singing at the Yerevan State Conservatory in Armenia and at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. She is a Samling Artist, holder of Bayreuth Scholarship, Ian Smith of Stornoway Opera Prize and Clonter Opera Prize, and a Georg Solti Foundation scholar.

Most recent and upcoming performances include the Opera Gala the Al Bustan Festival, Shostakovich Symphony Nr 14 with Southbank Sinfonia and her debut as Violetta Valery (La traviata) for the Scottish Opera.



KAMAL KHAN

American conductor and pianist Kamal Khan has performed with many opera companies around the world including the Metropolitan Opera, Dallas Opera, Baltimore Opera, Palm Beach Opera, Teatro Colón in Buenos Aires, Teatro Municipal in Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo in Brazil, Teatro de las Bellas Artes in Mexico City, Oper der Stadt Bonn and the Staatstheater Schwerin, Germany, Cape Town Opera, Opera South Africa, Opera de Puerto Rico and the International Festivals of Cervantino in Mexico and Santander, Mérida, La Coruña, Tenerife and Málaga in Spain. Additionally he has conducted the Jerusalem Symphony, Buenos Aires Philharmonic, Beijing Symphony, Shanghai Symphony, São Paulo Philharmonic, Balearic Islands Philharmonic, Oviedo Philharmonic, the Spanish Radio and Television Orchestra, Cape Town Philharmonic, Kwazulu-Natal Philharmonic and the Orchestra of the Academy of St Martin in the Fields. As a recitalist and accompanist Kamal Khan has appeared in venues such as Alice Tully Hall, Carnegie Hall and Weill Hall in New York, The Kennedy Center in Washington DC, Gran Teatro Liceu and the Palau de la Música Catalana in Barcelona, Palais Garnier in Paris, Suntory Hall and Casals Hall in Tokyo, the Palau de Congressos in Andorra and the Baxter Concert Hall and Montecasino in South Africa with singers such as Juan Pons, June Anderson, Veronica Villarroel, Pretty Yende, Nadine Sierra, Justino Diaz, Lauren Flanigan, Herman Prey and Ainoha Arteta. Prof. Khan is head of the Opera School at the University of Cape Town, Affiliate Faculty at the Royal Opera Covent Garden Jette Parker Young Artists Program and the Music and Artistic Director of the Mediterranean Opera Studio and Festival.



NATACHA KUDRITSKAYA

The young Natacha studied at the Lysenko school of Music until her seventeenth bithday. She then toured the United States with the Kiev Symphonic Orchestra from 1996 to 2002.

She joined the National Music Academy in Kiev at the age of nineteen whilst also studying at the National Music Academy in Paris. She graduated in 2007 with the highest honours.

Her studies were mainly influenced by four professors, starting with Alain Planès, «my first teacher, pure elegance and refinement». Then Jacques Rouvier, «very meticulous and demanding». Of meeting Ferenc Rados later in Budapest Kudritskaya says: «he taught me to read between the notes ». Finally Henri Barda "blew all my work away so that I could finally pay tribute to music".

Kudritskaya was extremely influenced by the music of Rameau and she has recorded two albums entirely dedicated to the French composer. In 2009 Kudritskaya entered several competitions and performed her first recitals. She also developed a liking for chamber music which lasts to this day. Kudritskaya started being invited to the main Festivals and Concert Halls across France and Europe including Wigmore Hall, the Concertgebouw in Bruges, the Philharmonie in Kiev, and the Oxford Chamber Music Festival.

Kudristkaya frequently goes back to the Ukraine. The events of 2014 were particularly moving for her as she performed a series of concerts in her native country during that time.



STEPHEN LANCASTER

Described as "a fine storyteller" (American Record Guide), "varied in tone and alive to feeling" (Fanfare Magazine), baritone Stephen Lancaster engages audiences through diverse repertoire in concert, recital, and opera. Winner of the Nico Castel International Master Singer Competition and The American Prize for men in art song and oratorio, he has been featured in venues around the world, including Carnegie Hall, Chicago Cultural Center, Chiang-Kai Shek Memorial Hall, Centro Cultural de Belém and Vatroslav Lisinski Concert Hall.

Recent performances include recitals for Gstaad New Year Music Festival, Musique dans le Grésivaudan, and Festival de Musique d'Uzerche and Le bal masqué with the South Bend Symphony Chamber Orchestra. A passionate recitalist, Lanacaster has performed as soloist in a wide range of repertoire, including various works by Bach, Handel, Haydn, Mozart, and Beethoven.

Lancaster enjoys crossing the boundary between classical and popular music: he toured Taiwan with a collaborative recital program "Art Song vs. Broadway" and performs arias and popular songs on tour with the Notre Dame Concert Band.

Born and raised in Canada, Lancaster earned certificates in piano and voice from The Royal Conservatory of Music before moving to the United States. he holds degrees from the University of Michigan (A.Mus.D.), the University of Notre Dame (M.M.), and Moody Bible Institute (B.Mus.) and serves as Associate Professor of the Practice at the University of Notre Dame.

He is also active in sacred music, performing regularly in concert with his husband, organist Kevin Vaughn.

She subsequently completed a two-year graduate string-quartet-in-residence program at Yale University's School of Music. Awards include Gold medal and Grand prize at the Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition and the ProQuartet Prize at the 9th Borciani String Quartet Competition.

WILLY MERZ

Willy Merz is a Swiss composer and conductor. He was born in Lausanne but studied in Torino, Italy, where he obtained both his double bassist and composer diplomas from the Torino Music Academy. He also graduated as a conductor from the Milano Music Academy and pursued his studies at the Chigiana Academy in Sienna with Franco Donatoni and later with F. Leitner. His musical language is constantly searching for new harmony proportions producing hyperbolical sounds as opposed to Euclidean ones.

He has received many important assignments by prestigious theaters such as the Teatro Colon in Buenos Aires and the Teatro Reggio in Torino. He often collaborates with renowned soloists and chamber orchestras.

He is the 2003 laureate of the International Composers' competition in Freiburg, Switzerland. He has been the in-house composer for the "Cité des Arts" in Paris, the "Altes Spittal" in Solothurn, Switzerland, and the Gustavsson Foundation in Iceland, among other international institutions.



NELSON MONFORT

Nelson Monfort is a French sports journalist born in Boulogne-Billancourt / Paris in 1953 to a Dutch mother and an American father who served with General Patton during the Second World War. This cosmopolitan background has given Nelson Monfort a liberal outlook on life.

Nelson Monfort was a very focused student who obtained his law degree before joining Sciences Politiques, Paris, and specializing in International Relations. He then left for San Francisco, United Sates, to spend some time working in finance. He came back to Europe perfectly bilingual, with his own special twang. By that time he had abandoned law in favor of journalism. He worked for the "Figaro", "Tennis Magazine", the "Journal du Dimanche", among many other publications, and also collaborated with French Radio stations.

His career really took off in 1987 when he interviewed the American tenniswomen Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova in English. He then became known as a sports interviewer who could easily switch from English to Spanish or from Italian to French. He has now been interviewing sports champions for over 25 years with various French television channels and is considered one of France's most popular journalists.

He had his own musical program on "Radio Classique" from 2007 to 2009 entitled "Les Mélodies de Nelson".

Nelson Monfort is a great lover of classical music, theater, opera and Russian literature. He has always had a passion for the French singer Jean Ferrat, whose biography he wrote in 2011. He is able to sing fifty songs of Jean Ferrat by heart!

The Russian pianist Natalia Morozova was born in Moscow and began her piano studies at the age of six at the Rachmaninoff School. She attended the Tchaikovski State Conservatory with the pianist Tigran Alikhanov. She pursued her piano studies while also studying chamber music. In 2001, she graduated with highest honors and went on to defend her doctoral dissertation in 2003 with similar excellent results. Between 2003 and 2005 she took advanced courses at the Chamber Music International School of the Trio of Trieste in Duino, Italy.

Natalia Morozova has received several international prizes, whether in Russia, Italy or Switzerland. Since 2010 she has been a member of the committee of the international "Primavera Musicale" project at the Discanto Academy of Arts in Verona, Italy, where she conducts a master class. Since 2012 she is part of the jury of the international competition "UmbriaMusicFest", Italy. Sought out as piano accompanist for her sensitivity and great skill in working with singers, she was selected to be part of the International Music Tournament (TIM) taking place in Europe.

Constantly seeking new forms of expression and knowledge, Natalia Morozova's repertoire has only continued to increase in the fields of baroque music and modern sonority.



SHERNIYAZ MUSSAKHAN

Sherniyaz Mussakhan was born on November 29th, 1993, in Almaty, Kazakhstan. He began his first violin lessons at the age of five and in 2002 he started his studies at the Almaty State Music School for talented children. During the Moscow Virtuosos's tour in Almaty in April 2002 the outstanding violinist Vladimir Spivakov gave Sherniyaz a master class and spoke highly of him. Spivakov presented the young boy with a violin and advised him to enter the Tchaikovsky Music Academy in Moscow. Sherniyaz studied in Moscow From 2003 till 2011 and then went on to win several prestigious awards. In 2011 he graduated from the Moscow Academy as an external student.

During his career Sherniyaz has appeared on many renowned stages in Russia and Europe. He has taken part in several master classes led by distinguished violonists and also played as a soloist with the Moscow State Symphonic Orchestra, the Polish Symphonic Orchestra and the Kazakh Symphonic Orchestra. He has appeared with prestigious orchestras including the London Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the Moscow State Symphonic Orchestra and several leading orchestras from Kazakhstan. In 2014 Sherniyaz successfully graduated from the Lausanne Academy of Music under the tuition of prof. P. Vernikov and still is a master student at the same school. In 2014 he received a "Rahn Kulturfonds" scholarship and the Kiefer Hablitzel Prize.

In May 2015 Sherniyaz Mussakhan became the artistic director of the "Young Eurasian Soloists" (YES) chamber orchestra. The orchestra often performs for the Gstaad New Year Music Festival.



INVA MULA

Inva Mula was born in Tirana, Albania to an Albanian father from Gjakove and a Russian mother. In 1987 she won the Cantante d'Albania competition in Tirana and in 1988 the George Enescu Competition in Bucharest. In 1992 she won the Butterfly Competition in Barcelona. She received an award at Plácido Domingo's first Operalia International Opera Com-petition contest in Paris, 1993. A CD of the event was released.

She later performed in various concerts and operas at the Opéra Bastille in Paris, and in Brussels for Europalia Mexico, in Munich, and in Oslo among many others. Inva Mula has sung in Médée, Lucia di Lammermoor, La Bohème, Manon, Ivan IV, Falstaff, Rigoletto, etc. She is also a renowned Violetta in La Traviata, and has sung the role in many cities around the world, including Tokyo, Bilbao, Orange, Trieste, and Toronto. In 2007, she performed Adina in L'elisir d'amore at Toulouse, and in 2009 she sang the title role in Gounod's Mireille with the Paris Opera at the Palais Garnier, a performance that was issued on DVD.



ARISTIDE NAJEAN

Aristide Najean has been painting since childhood using all kinds of materials and varied textures. At 17 he conquered his autonomy working as an illustrator at an advertising agency in Poitiers (France). The following year he collaborated with Maurice Felt at his engraving atelier (copper-plate engraving) in Paris. He worked with a variety of artists from the Galerie Maeght: Clavé, Adami, Garache... At the same time, he was autonomously studying architecture and, at 19, artistic anatomy in Munich. One year later he studied fresco techniques, pigments and colors in Florence. At 23, he was back at Maurice Felt's atelier. In 1986, he discovered Murano's glass. Glass Master Mario Badioli welcomed him into his atelier. Here he developed his own glass research. This glass sculpturing became an extension of his painting, with glass its most evident expression. In 2005, overtaking the Venetian tradition, he started realising lighting elements. In spring 2008, he met Philippe Starck in Murano. At Starck's instigation Najean has realized with happiness many glass projects, as at Royal Monceau in Parigi, Palazzina Grassi in Venice and many others. Invited by Starck, he collaborates with Baccarat, flagship of the french cristal. His work and creations has caught the attention of international architects as Jean-Michel Wilmotte. On the invitation of the Chef Alain Ducasse, he realized pieces respectively with Bruno Moinard, Patrick Jouin and Sanjit Manku pieces for The Dorchester in Londres, Plaza Athénée in Paris and Hôtel de Paris in Monte-Carlo. In october 2015 he moves in the former furnace from the great glass Master Alfredo Barbini, completely redone at the technological, ecological norms and at Najean's colours, in order to push further forward the researches and his creativity. Najean is on his Cathédrala's stand.













SIMPLY MAGIC









DEBORAH NEMTANU

Deborah Nemtanu was born in Bordeaux in 1983 to a musician family. A precocious artist, she started playing the violin at the age of 4. In 2001 she was awarded a first prize by the National Music Academy in Paris and went on to obtain the Maurice Ravel Academy first prize that same year. Several more distinctions followed, such as the second prize at the 2008 Benjamin Britten competition in London which allowed her to play with the Royal Philarmonic Orchestra. Deborah Nemtanu has been first violin of the Paris Chamber Orchestra since 2005. She regularly appears at the Champs-Elysees theater with prestigious conductors. She has broadened her knowledge by also playing the viola and sometimes conducting the Paris Chamber Orchestra. She has also performed as a soloist at several festivals across Europe and played alongside international stars such as Emmanuel Pahud, Fazil Say or Daniel Hope. She has recorded several pieces with her sister Sarah, also a violinist. The young prodigy was awarded the distinction of "Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres" in February 2016. She plays on a 1740 Domenico Montagnana violin.



YVES PRIN

Yves Prin has composed over one hundred works consisting of one opera, two symphonies, five concertos and ten song cycles. He first started as a pianist and a conductor but veered from this classical path to become mainly a composer.

He worked with Radio France for more than fifteen years, going from musical director of its Philarmonic Orchestra to being responsible for creation and music and supervising the "Presence" Festival. Over that period of time he conducted several world premieres, whether symphonic, orchestral or lyrical.

Yves Prin recently finished composing the "Archipel de Soie", a symphonic suite with lyrical components based on the novel by Alessandro Baricco. One of his most recent works is a symphonic suite entitled "Nymphéas" as a tribute to Claude Monet and Claude Debussy. In April 2016 his "Seis Cançoes do folklore brasileo" were performed to great applause by the soprano Maria Bayo at the Teatro Real in Madrid.



MAGUELONE PARIGOT

It is in Orléans that Maguelone started playing the piano and obtained her First Prize. Then, having brilliantly completed her piano studies at the CNSM in Lyon, she takes her first steps towards the lyrical repertoire when she met Therese Cochet, choirmaster at the Opéra National de Paris. Then at the CNSM in Paris, she easily obtained her diplomas of accompaniment as well as melody and Lied, supported by the specialist Ruben Lifschitz. Today, Maguelone Parigot, in addition to her participation in Olivier Charlier's violin class at CNSM, likes very much to join eagerly professional singers in recitals. Having a great taste for vocal music, she also likes to accompany students of the Maurice Ravel conservatory. Maguelone Parigot has been a accompanying pianist for the 2014, 2015 and 2016 editions of the Belcanto International Competition, Vincenzo Bellini.



JULIAN RACHLIN

Julian Rachlin is one of the most exciting and respected violinists of our time. Over the last 27 years, the Lithuanian-born artist has been captivating audiences around the world with his distinctively rich sound, superb musicianship and outstanding interpretations. He has established close relationships with many of the most prestigious conductors and orchestras. Always willing to expand his musical horizons, Julian is also praised as a viola player and conductor. For 12 years, Julian has been leading the internationally renowned "Julian Rachlin & Friends" festival in Dubrovnik, Croatia, a platform for creative projects with leading musicians and actors. Besides delighting his audiences with his musical performances, Julian is also receiving recognition as a young philanthropist for his charity work as a UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador and his educational outreach.

Julian Rachlin recently toured Europe and North America with the Orchestre National de France, he opened the season of La Scala Philharmonic Orchestra with Riccardo Chailly, and performed at the Lucerne Festival. Other highlights as soloist included his debut at the Edinburgh Festival. In 2016 Julian Rachlin played for the French National Day's open air concert at the Eiffel Tower.



BENJAMIN RIGHETTI

Benjamin Righetti was born in Switzerland in 1982 and found his passion for keyboard instruments at a young age – first for piano, organ and harpsichord and later for clavichord and fortepiano. It is on the 'king of instruments' that he first achieved international recognition. Between 2002 and 2007 he collected awards at some of the most prestigious competitions throughout the world – ranging from the Swiss National Organ Competition to the Grand Prix d'Orgue from the City of Paris.

His career has since developed as he divides his time between appearances as a soloist throughout Europe and beyond and a busy schedule as a teacher and recording artist. Among Righetti's several hundred concerts to date, notable highlights have included performances in Notre- Dame de Paris on his 25th birthday, appearances as a soloist with the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande, as well as cathedral and church recitals in Spain and Italy. Righetti's three CD recordings issued so far have been greeted by universal critical acclaim. The reviews speak for themselves: "interpretations distinguished by freshness and clarity . . . a very mature account . . . the effect is stunning . . . the result is simply spectacular . . . lyricism prevails in phrasing of rare perfection . . .".



ILAN ROGOFF

Ilan Rogoff has appeared in most European, American and Latin American music centres as well as in South Africa, Japan and the Far East. He is renowned for his interpretations of the Romantic composers. His recordings of the Fantasies of Schumann and Schubert (on the Nimbus label) were chosen as one of the year's best by «Records & Recordings». He combines his concert schedule with Master Classes which he conducted, among others, at the Chopin Academy in Warsaw, at the Tansman Festival in Lodz, for EPTA (European Piano Teachers Association), in Norfolk, Va., Washington D.C., in Israel, South America, Korea and at the "Cursos Manuel De Falla" as part of the International Music & Dance Festival in Granada, Spain.

The acclaim and awards won by his double CD encompassing the integral works composed by Chopin in Mallorca and related works («Chopin in Mallorca» - Preludio/Blau Records 10011/2), is now in its tenth edition. His CD recording of both Chopin Concerti in the version for piano and Strings Quintet was recorded with the soloists of the Vienna Chamber Orchestra, a version which received the highest accolades from music critics and audiences. His latest CD contains his transcriptions and arrangements for piano solo of twelve works by Astor Piazzolla, titled "Urban Nostalgia".



SASHA ROZHDESTVENSKY

Sasha Rozhdestvensky is considered to be one of Russia's finest young violinists. Yehudi Menuhin pronounced him to be "one of the most talented and refined violinists of his generation", while the legendary violinist Ivry Gitlis said of him: "He belongs to the great line of outstanding artists. His approach and relationship to music and the violin is intense, highly sensitive and intelligent".

He has appeared internationally with leading orchestras such as the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Europe, Deutsches Symphonie Orchester, London Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra Sinfonica dell'Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia, Orchestra of "La Scala", Tonhalle Orchestra Zurich, Dresdner Philharmonie Orchestra, whether in Europe, the United States, Australia or Asia.

Sasha Rozhdestvensky has worked with numerous conductors such as Vladimir Ashkenazy, Yuri Bashmet, Jean Claude Casadesus, and Valery Gergiev, to name but a few.



DR. MAIJARGAL SANJMYATAV

Art critic, Maijargal Sanjmyatav studied in the Ulan-Bator Musical college. Graduated from the Moscow State Institute of Foreign Languages and from the Russian National University of Theatrical Art prior to earning her doctoral degree from the Art Research Institute in Moscow. She serves as a Member of the Academic Board of the Mongolian National University of Art and Culture.

Dr.Maijargal Sanjmyatav is the Princess of the 28th generation of the Golden lineage of Chinggis Khaan. Prof. Maijargal Sanjmyatav is the Founder and President of the Mongolian Shakespeare Society. She works as a member of jury at various theater and art festivals on national and international level.



NATHALIE STUTZMANN & ORFEO 55

Nathalie Stutzmann is considered one of the most outstanding musical personalities of our time, with parallel careers as both Contralto and Conductor. Her charismatic musicianship, the unique combination of rigour and fantasy which characterises her style have been recognised by her peers, audience and critics alike. She founded the ensemble Orfeo 55 in 2009, and their new album of Italian arias, Quella Fiamma, has just been released under Warner/Erato. Other recordings are: Prima Donna (2011), a collection of Vivaldi's arias for contralto, and Une Cantate imaginaire, which celebrates Bach with a selection of his most notable arias, released under the Deutsche Grammophon label, and Heroes from the shadows, arias written for Handel's secondary operatic characters, released under Warner/Erato. All of them received critical acclaim and awards such as Diapason d'Or, Melómano de Oro and Editor's Choice in Gramophone. From September 2018, she will be Chief Conductor of Kristiansand Symphony Orchestra in Norway. She is also Principal Guest Conductor of RTÉ National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland and Associate Artist of the Sao Paulo State Symphony Orchestra.



GENC TUKIÇI

Genc Tukiçi is an Albanian-French pianist and composer. A graduate of the Conservatory of Tirana, he then obtained the Soloist Diploma from the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris - Alfred Cortot, where he is currently a professor. His international career as a concert pianist led him to play in the biggest venues. Some concerts, including Salle Gaveau and "Salle Cortot" in Paris, at the Théâtre antique d'Orange, or CAMI Hall in New York City, have earned him recognition as one of the most outstanding instrumentalists of his generation. He received a prestigious recognition from Nino Rota, who described him as "a great musician of international level", and noted in particular his "superb interpretations of heart and mind, in perfect symbiosis with the orchestra." His interpretations were the subject of records, particularly the ones recorded with the symphonic orchestras of the National Theatre of Opera in Tirana and Macedonian Opera Theatre, with the Russian Tchaikovsky orchestra or orchestras of the Albanian and Slovenian national television. As a composer, he created and recorded various pieces for piano and orchestra, including several musical "paraphrases" on themes from Puccini, Verdi, and Offenbach. A CD of his compositions, together with Inva Mula and inspired by patriotic themes, was released in November 2012: it includes parts for soprano, piano and orchestra. He also composed and orchestrated la "Valse Céleste", a hymn for Mother Teresa, arranged for soloist, choir and orchestra. This hymn was played in Vatican in 2016 for Mother Teresa's canonisation together with Inva Mula, and Bujar Llapaj.



LEONTINA VADUVA

Leontina Vaduva is an acclaimed Romanian soprano. She studied at the Bucharest Conservator with Ileana Cotrubaş, and debuted in the title role of Manon at Toulouse, in 1987. A recipient of the Laurence Olivier Opera Award, she has often appeared at Covent Garden, in Rigoletto, Carmen and Roméo et Juliette. Leontina Vaduva is the daughter of the Romanian popular music singer Maria Ciobanu.

In 2000, Vaduva appeared at the Metropolitan Opera, in six performances of La bohème (as Mimì). The soprano has also sung with the companies of Buenos Aires, Barcelona, Cologne, Vienna, and Paris. Her discography includes Rigoletto (1993), Les contes d'Hoffmann (as Antonia, with Roberto Alagna, conducted by Kent Nagano, 1994–96), La bohème (again with Alagna, led by Sir Antonio Pappano, 1995), and an album of « Opera Arias » conducted by Plácido Domingo (1997). Especially noteworthy is her DVD of Roméo et Juliette, with Alagna, conducted by Sir Charles Mackerras and directed by Nicolas Joël (1994).



BEATRICE VILLIGER

Beatrice Villiger first appeared on stage in 2008 as Annina in La Traviata and went on to appear in several independent productions. She has performed all over Europe, America and Asia and given master classes in India. Conductor Philip Bach has accompanied her with his baton and she has performed during the Menuhin Festival in Gstaad. She has also sung alongside stars such as Noemi Nadelmann and Renato Bruson. Beatrice Villiger became the artistic director of "Le Bois qui Chante" music Festival in Château-d'Oex, Switzerland, in 2013.



THE YOUNG EURASIAN SOLOISTS QUARTET

The Young Eurasian Soloists was created in May 2015 and performed its first concert in Kazakhstan during that same month.


